INTERNATIONAL FUTURES

INTERNATIONAL FUTURES (*IF*) took place for the first time in August 2007. This successful training initiative organized by the Federal Foreign Office's Training for International Diplomats is geared towards international young leaders from the world of diplomacy and academia as well as politics and civil society, making it the first programme to consciously build networks between these target groups. Participating countries are Brazil, China, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Pakistan, South Africa and Germany.

INTERNATIONAL FUTURES is a two-week exercise conducted by the Federal Foreign Office in Berlin as part of the *Managing Global Governance* programme organized by the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

Around 20 participants from universities, think tanks, NGOs and ministries in the above-mentioned countries attend the entire six-month *Managing Global Governance* course. In addition, INTERNATIONAL FUTURES brings in young diplomats from these countries, who contribute their foreign policy expertise to the group. Together they explore both the opportunities and challenges for diplomacy in the age of globalization and – departing from a more traditional foreign-policy focus – discuss the role of global governance in today's world. The goal of INTERNATIONAL FUTURES is to create a global community of responsibility by connecting young leaders and imparting vital skills for joint leadership.

INTERNATIONAL FUTURES is designed as a "diplomatic trip around the world." Several topics provide a comprehensive introduction to diplomacy for the 21st century. The approach is practice-oriented and interactive. To ensure a variety of perspectives and methods, both academics and practitioners plan and run the seminars and workshops. With the aid of simulations, visits and role plays participants seek to devise strategic solutions to global challenges. Programme Director Peter Gottwald, a former German ambassador, is fully involved throughout. The working language is English.

The legal basis of International Futures is a cooperation agreement between the Federal Foreign Office and the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). International Futures is financed by the BMZ and the Federal Foreign Office and organized by the Federal Foreign Office with the assistance of the European Academy Berlin (EAB). The *Managing Global Governance* programme is run by the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ – German Agency for International Cooperation) and the German Development Institute/Deutsches Institut für Entwicklungspolitik (DIE).

Berlin Wall Memorial

The Berlin Wall Memorial is the central memorial site of the divided Germany, located in the centre of the capital. Situated at the historic site on Bernauer Straße, it extends along 1.4 kilometres of the former border strip. The memorial contains the last piece of Berlin Wall with the preserved grounds behind it and is thus able to convey an impression of how the border fortifications developed until the end of the 1980s. The events that took place here together with the preserved historical remnants and traces of border obstacles on display help to make the history of Germany's division comprehensible to visitors.

European Academy Berlin (EAB)

The European Academy Berlin organises seminars, conferences, presentations and other events addressing European issues. The European Academy Berlin brings together people from various countries in Europe and the rest of the world, so that they may discuss common challenges and opportunities. The European Academy Berlin can provide experts and information tailored to the target group on the topic of European integration. In this process it especially stresses the importance of transmitting interconnections.

Friedrich Ebert Stiftung

Friedrich Ebert Stiftung (FES) is a political foundation. It is close to the Social Democrats. There are other political foundations close to the other parties represented in the German parliament. The promotion of young talent has been one of the founding principles of the FES. At the time when Friedrich Ebert was elected as the first president of the Weimar Republic, it was almost impossible for talented children from socially disadvantaged backgrounds to study at universities or take part in research programmes. With the foundation of the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung in 1925, the first scholarships were awarded to particularly talented young individuals from a working class milieu who were taking an active part in the young democracy of the Weimar Republic.

To address social disadvantages by supporting students who actively work for freedom, justice and social cohesion in their commitment to social democracy, or will do so in future, continues to be one of the aims of the FES.





Besides that, the aim of the international activities of the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES) is to promote democracy and development, to contribute to peace and security, to work to make globalization socially equitable, and to support the continued development of the European Union. Through its projects in over 100 countries, the FES supports building and strengthening civil society and public institutions.

KfW Banking Group

The KfW banking group is a German government-owned development bank, based in Frankfurt. Its name originally derives from *Kreditanstalt für Wiederaufbau*, meaning Bank for Reconstruction. It was formed in 1948 after World War II as part of the Marshall Plan and is designed to assist developing countries and the German economy. KfW provides funds for housing, infrastructure, environmental protection and preservation and venture capital. KfW is also involved in funding telecommunications, transportation, energy infrastructure and industrial projects around the world.





Hamburg

Führungsakademie der Bundeswehr

Since 1957, military top-level personnel have been prepared at the Führungsakademie der Bundeswehr for demanding tasks in the armed forces, in NATO, the European Union and in the United Nations. The core tasks of the Academy is to provide training, advanced and further training to professionally experienced officers from Germany and abroad.

At the end of the training, the leadership personnel is comprehensively trained and educated. They are also familiar with scientific work methods and thus be able to handle issues of national preventive security in a Bundeswehr-wide, joint, combined and interagency context. At the Führungsakademie, there are permanently more than 600 course participants, among them about 250 foreign officers from about 50 nations. Each year, the Führungsakademie provides training and education to more than 3,000 course participants in 80 different courses and seminars.

GIGA German Institute of Global and Area Studies

The GIGA German Institute of Global and Area Studies is an independent social-science research institute based in Hamburg. It analyses political, social and economic developments in Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Middle East and combines this analysis with innovative comparative research on international relations, development and globalisation, violence and security, and political systems. On the basis of this research, the GIGA advises political, economic and social decision-makers. The GIGA has 160 staff members and belongs to the Leibniz Association.

International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (ITLOS)

The International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea (ITLOS) is an intergovernmental organization created by the mandate of the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea. It was established by the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, signed at Montego Bay, Jamaica, on December 10, 1982. The Convention entered into force on November 16, 1994, and established an international framework for law over "all ocean space, its uses and resources". The tribunal is based in Hamburg, Germany and aims to settle disputes.





Spiegel

Der Spiegel is one of Germany's most prominent news magazines and probably the first of its kind in Germany. It had an average circulation of 920.000 copies in 2012, 91% sold in Germany. Since its beginning in 1947 the magazine has assumed a name in investigative journalism. The most famous case was back in the beginning of the 1960s when a story on the defence readiness status of the German Armed Forces induced the government to imprison the editor and some members of the magazine's journalistic staff – all of which ended in the resignation of the Minister of defence and the release of the journalists. The printed version of the Hamburg-based magazine is published weekly and covers a wide range of topics, including politics and economy, science and technology as well as culture, society and sports. The magazine's online presence, Spiegel Online, is among the most read news sources on the German-speaking internet.
